# MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. LOCALYOUTH AWARDS

This competition awards local youth essay, poetry and visual art submissions that best represent the theme of the 2025 Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Celebration, Let Us March On. This theme stems from Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s speech "Our God is Marching On" that he delivered on March 25, 1965 on the steps of the State Capitol Building at the conclusion of the Selma to Montgomery march. This 54-mile march had 25,000 participants protesting the racism and oppression that African Americans faced at the polls while exercising their constitutional right to vote.

Entries should not include any vulgar language or potentially offensive or explicit materials/images.
